### FIND INSPIRATION

- Check out what anchors the rooms that you are inspired by. i.e. is it the rug, the light fixture, etc.

# CHOOSE YOUR MUST HAVES

#### MUST HAVES

- Begin listing items that you know you cannot live without. Those are going to be your anchor items. For example, in my master bedroom our *Terracotta Loren rug* was the one item I had to have.

- Make a list of all of the items you plan to buy, and do your best not to stray from the list when shopping in store or online.

## ICTURE ERFECT

#### ALWAYS TAKE PICTURES

- Whether you shop online or in store, my number one tip is to have a picture of your space with you. ALWAYS. If you don't you may find it hard to picture items in your room you are shopping for.
- I also typically take pictures of the items that I will be repurposing for the space. For example, if I have a vase that I will be using that was already in my home, I take a picture of it as well.

### QUICK TIPS I'VE LEARNED

- You may have heard someone say, "Oh just buy it, you'll find a place for it." Girl don't. Save your money and find something you KNOW you will use. Believe me!
